A national summit 30 April 2020

Chronic kidney disease affects over 10% of the adult population and is associated with high risk of early death and/or progression to end-stage kidney disease. In many parts of the UK colleagues are working to develop new models of care, collaborating across sectors to develop virtual clinics.



This one-day summit will assess the current status of virtual CKD services and produce a road map for further development.
